A Mid-Summer Tradition—The 13th Annual Little Compton Summer Art Show

The 13th Annual Little Compton Juried Art show will be held at the Little Compton Community Center, Saturday, July 16th & Sunday, July 17th from 10 AM to 4 PM. The show is free and open to the public

There will be a special Patron's Preview Party (\$100 donation) on Friday, July 15th with early viewing at 5 PM; followed by an Artist's Reception and preferred admission (\$10) from 6 to 8 PM. Awards will be presented at 7 PM.

The show is juried, open to any artist who wishes to enter. Judges this year will be Mary Chandor, R. Tripp Evans and Kathleen Weber.

The entry fee is \$15 per entry, with a limit of two entries per artist. Oil, watercolor, drawing, sculpture, acrylic, pastel, mixed media and hand-pulled prints are eligible for entry. Off-set, computer generated prints are not eligible.

All art must be framed, priced and available for sale. All interested artists should contact the Community Center for more information and a registration form.

Awards include: "Best in Show" (\$200), four "Awards of Excellence" (\$100 each) and three Honorable Mentions. These awards are named in honor of Little Compton artists David Aldrich, Molly Luce Burroughs, Mary Elizabeth Post and Betty Burroughs Woodhouse. This year's show also features a "People's Choice Award" - all attendees will cast their vote for what they consider to be the best piece of art work in the show. A silent auction will run all weekend for an original Dora Atwater Millikin painting.

The deadline for submissions is May 23rd at 4 PM at the Center. The entry fee is \$15.00 for each entry, students \$5.00 per entry. Limit of 2 entries per photographer.
